#### **Introduction:**

Spain launched the implementation of the Dual modality in VET programmes in 2013 through the introduction of a new regulation allowing the possibility to develop dual VET programs in the initial Education and Training system. The implementation of the rule has led to different implementation experiences.

In 2018, the Spanish government requested the support from the Structural Reform Support Service (SRSS) to analyse national best practices, identify the main challenges encountered so far, as well as to get practical inputs from other reference international models.

For this workshop, the SRSS is mobilising experts from the Dutch SBB, the German BIBB, the Swiss Institute for Labour Economics and the Portuguese IEFP, together with the cooperation of the Ministry of Education ad VET, the Autonomous Regions and the Bertelsmann Foundation.

The objective of these working sessions is to raise awareness among stakeholders on the potential of the dual VET model, to eventually identify and agree on the relevant success factors that set the basis for high quality implementation models of Dual VET aligned to the EQAVET framework.

## The Foundation for Cooperation on VET and the Labour Market Samenwerkingsorganisatie Beroepsonderwijs Bedrijfsleven (SBB).

The SBB was established on request of the Dutch Ministry of Education in 2012 to provide one-way advice on VET policy to the Ministry.

The SBB is responsible for the cooperation between VET education and the world of work. Within SBB they work together on themes such as the VET qualifications structure, examination, work placement and the offer of training programs. With that, SBB optimizes the connection between education and the labour market, the goal of which is: delivering sufficient and well-qualified professionals.

The Federal Institute for Vocational Education and Training (Bundesinstitut für Berufsbildung, BIBB) is the core institution for consensus building between all parties involved in VET. It conducts research on in-company training and provides services and advice to the federal government and VET providers. It advises the government on fundamental issues of in-company vocational training and is involved in setting standards and designing training regulations.

**The Swiss Federal Institute for Vocational Education and Training SFIVET** is the Swiss expert organisation for vocational education and training. They provide services in the following areas: Basic training of VET professionals, Continuing training of VET professionals, Research and development in the VET/PET field, Development of Occupations, education and training cooperation.

**The Institute for Employment and Vocational Training, (Instituto de Emprego e Formação Profissional, IEFP)** is the Portuguese public employment service and was established in 1979. It works under the auspices of the Ministry of Solidarity, Employment and Social Security, being responsible for implementing the employment and vocational training policies defined and approved by the Government.

**Fundación Bertelsmann** is a Spanish foundation linked to the German Bertelsmann Stiftung, which develops social projects under the slogan "For youth employment". With the project "Alianza para la FP Dual', it aims to contribute to the development and promotion of a high quality dual VET system in Spain. It has set up a network with currently 1000 members including companies, VET schools and other organisations who actively collaborate to improve the current Spanish dual VET.
