3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The holder of this certificate will have acquired the **general competence** to program, organise and supervise the inventory and restocking work of animal and vegetable species in the natural habitat and improve the habitat of game and inland water species, legally controlling the populations of predators, managing the material and human resources available, applying criteria of quality and profitability and respecting current regulations, including environmental and occupational risk prevention regulation. This general competence is divided into the following **skills units (UC)**:

- Organise and supervise the inventory and monitoring operations of the natural habitat (UC1486_3).
- Manage the work derived from the planning and monitoring of the inland water species habitat (UC1498_3).
- Manage the work derived from the planning of the habitat of game species (UC1499_3).
- Manage the restocking of game (UC1500_3).
- Control the populations of predators of inland water and game species (UC1501_3).
- Manage the machinery, equipment and installations used in forestry work (UC0730_3).

The professional skills are acquired through the **learning outcomes** defined within the related Training Modules (MF):

- Organisation and supervision of the inventory operations and monitoring of the natural habitat. (MF1486_3)
- Management of work on the inland water species habitat (MF1498_3).
- Management of work on the game habitat (MF1499_3).
- Management of the restocking of game (MF1500_3).
- Control of the populations of predators of inland water and game species (MF1501_3).
- Management of the machinery, equipment and installations used in forestry work (MF0730_3).
- Practical training at the workplace in management of hunting-fishing activities (MP0477)

As a reference the learning outcomes include in the Practical training at the workplace that complete and reinforce the learning outcomes acquired in the other training modules, are:

- Organise work on a census of animals.
- Organise the inventory of vegetation.
- Collaborate on control of conservation and improvement of the habitat.
- Control the most significant predators of game, according to the species and resources and methods used.
- Control the most significant predators of inland water species, according to the species and resources and methods used.
- Control the state and operating conditions of the machinery, equipment and forest installations, as well as their use.
- Organise a workshop for the maintenance and repair of machinery, equipment and forestry installations and coordinate its operation.
- Take part in the company's working processes, following the rules and instructions established at the workplace.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THIS CERTIFICATE

The holder of this certificate may work in the agricultural sector, within the forestry sub-sector, in the area of hunting/fishing management, in the following productive activities: Companies dedicated to the inventory, planning and management of the natural habitat. Companies dedicated to the management of fish and crayfish, and to the repopulation, adaptation and maintenance of the inland water species habitat. Companies dedicated to the management of hunting reserves, repopulation of game and the "turnkey" adaptation and preparation of the hunting area for these purposes. Companies dedicated to the physical, chemical and biological quality control of waters and carrying out censuses and monitoring of inland populations of water species. Companies related to forestry and other woodland-related activities. Companies providing forestry support services. Hunting, capture of animals and services related to them; Fishing and aquaculture. Infrastructure construction companies for organising the management of the habitats of inland water or hunting species; Concessionary companies for hydroelectric systems; Companies that carry out tourism operations linked to nature; Botanical gardens, zoos and nature reserves and Universities, institutes and other institutions related to research and experimentation in this sector. The most pertinent occupations and positions are:

- Agricultural supervisor or worker, except in vegetable gardens, greenhouses, nurseries and gardens.
- Worker qualified in hunting activities.
- Supervisor or worker in activities providing technical assistance for inventories, planning and monitoring the inland water species habitat and the game habitat.
- Supervisor or worker in restocking game, fish and crustaceans.
- Supervisor or worker in works adapting the inland water species habitat and game species.
- Supervisor in a nature reserve, official game reserve, public hunting area, among others, whether government owned or managed by universities-research centres.
- Worker specialising in activities of legal control over predators or invasive species.
- Coordinator of work of rural surveillance.
- Supervisor in a hunting/fishing tourism company.

5. OFFICIAL BASIS OF THE CERTIFICATE

Name and status of the national/regional authority providing accreditation/recognition of the certificate

The Ministry of Employment and Social Security or the corresponding autonomous regional administration within the scope of its competence, in the name of the King. The certificate is valid throughout Spain.

Level of the certificate

The Professional Certificate Level 3 of the National Repertoire of Professional Certificates corresponds to level 4 of the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED-P 2011).

The European Qualification Framework (EQF) level:

Grading scale/Pass requirements

The grading scale and pass level of the training modules are expressed on a scale of 0 to 10. The minimum score for a pass is 5 in every training module including a pass in the practical training at the workplace module.

The grading system is as follows:

- FAIL: 0 to 4.9
- PASS-SATISFACTORY: 5 to 6.9
- PASS-GOOD: 7 to 8.9
- PASS-EXCELLENT: 9 to 10

Access to next level of education/training

This Professional Certificate Level 3 gives access to Professional Certificate Level 3 within the same professional area and family.

For validation purposes, the educational authorities will recognise the professional module or modules of the VET diplomas corresponding to the skills units included in the training modules of this certificate.

Legal basis

Royal Decree 627/2013 of 2 August, establishing seven professional certificates in the professional family Agriculture, included in the National Repertoire of Professional Certificates, and updating the professional certificates established as

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

This certificate may be acquired by:

1. Training: Completion with a pass grade of the face-to-face or online training programme.
2. Recognition of the professional skills acquired through professional experience or non-formal training (prior learning): Completion of a process of skills evaluation and accreditation in all the skills units making up the professional certificate.
3. Dual training: Completion of a training and apprenticeship contract, which may range from 1 year (or 6 months, if stipulated as such in the collective agreement) to 3 years, during which effective working time is combined with time dedicated to training under the training programme for the professional certificate.

The training method (number 1 above) requires successful completion of the training modules and the practical training at the workplace:

Entry/access requirements:

- *Bachiller* Diploma (upper secondary education); or
- Professional Certificate Level 2 in the same professional area.
- If neither of the above or higher certifications are held, a pass in the key skills tests.

Additional information: Professional certificates are instruments for official accreditation of the professional qualifications in the National Catalogue of Professional Qualifications for all economic activities, within the scope of the labour administration. The National Repertoire of Professional Certificates is divided into three qualification levels (Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3), and by sectors into 26 professional families and 102 professional areas.
