#### 1. TITLE OF THE CERTIFICATE (ES)

Professional Certificate Level 3 in IMSV0308 FILM, VIDEO AND TELEVISION CAMERA (This translation has no legal status)

#### 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The holder of this certificate will have acquired the **general competence** to capture and record images and sounds of all kinds in audiovisual productions, handling the camera, recording sound in ENG productions, and collaborating on the planning of the process and on the lighting, aiming for the highest level of technical, artistic and aesthetic quality of the takes, in accordance with the indications of the photographic director and/or director/producer, while contributing the holder's own criteria. This general competence is divided into the following **skills units** (UC):

- Collaborate on the development of the plan to film and record audiovisual projects (UC0939 3).
- Verify the technical appropriateness and operational level of the resources for filming and recording (UC0940\_3).
- Collaborate on the design and execution of the lighting for audiovisual productions (UC0941\_3).
- Obtain images according to the technical, artistic and communicative criteria of the audiovisual project (UC0942\_3).

The professional skills are acquired through the **learning outcomes** defined within the related Training Modules (MF):

- Development of the plan for camera filming and recording (MF0939\_3)
- Technical camera resources (MF0940 3)
- Lighting for audiovisual productions (MF0941\_3)
- Capture of the audiovisual image (MF0942\_3)
- Practical training at the workplace in Film, video and television camera (MP0137)

(See legal basis for all learning outcomes information acquired by the holder of this Certificate in each MF).

As a reference the learning outcomes include in the Practical training at the workplace that complete and reinforce the learning outcomes acquired in the other training modules, are:

- Participate in planning the process of filming/recording images in audiovisual productions, following criteria for achieving quality and optimising resources.
- Check the operation of the cameras by carrying out any necessary tests to ensure correct performance during the filming/recording of the project.
- Participate in the lighting of an audiovisual project.
- Operate the camera during the filming/recording of images, making any modifications or adjustments that may be needed, and following the guidelines for stage design to ensure the desired technical and expressive results.
- Check the operation of the image filming equipment in multimedia productions and operate the cameras, following the instructions from the director and ensuring the quality of the images.
- Record images and sound with light recording equipment (ENG/DNG), following indications given.
- Take part in the company's working processes, following the rules and instructions established at the workplace.



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#### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THIS CERTIFICATE

The holder of this certificate may work in the audiovisual sector within the area of filming, image recording and lighting, at film and video producers, television broadcasters, and companies producing live shows.

The most pertinent occupations and positions are:

- Cabin operator for film projections.
- Camera operator (film, TV and/or video).
- Film camera operator.
- Video camera operator.
- TV camera operator.
- Assistant film cameraman.
- Assistant cameraman.
- Assistant camera operator.
- ENG (Electronic News Gathering) cameraman.
- Specialised cameraman.
- Lighting assistant.

The holder of this professional certificate has recognition of the basic level training in labour risk prevention, according to Annex IV of the Royal Decree 39/1997 of 17 of January approving the Labour Risks Prevention Act.

#### 5. OFFICIAL BASIS OF THE CERTIFICATE

#### Name and status of the national/regional authority providing accreditation/recognition of the certificate

The Ministry of Employment and Social Security or the corresponding autonomous regional administration within the scope of its competence, in the name of the King. The certificate is valid throughout Spain.

#### Level of the certificate

The Professional Certificate Level 3 of the National Repertoire of Professional Certificates corresponds to level 4 of the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED-P 2011).

The European Qualification Framework (EQF) level:

#### **Grading scale/Pass requirements**

The grading scale and pass level of the training modules are expressed on a scale of 0 to 10. The minimum score for a pass is 5 in every training module including a pass in the practical training at the workplace module.

The grading system is as follows:

FAIL: 0 to 4.9

PASS-SATISFACTORY: 5 to 6.9

PASS-GOOD: 7 to 8.9PASS-EXCELLENT: 9 to 10

#### Access to next level of education/training

This Professional Certificate Level 3 gives access to Professional Certificate Level 3 within the same professional area and family.

For validation purposes, the educational authorities will recognise the professional module or modules of the VET diplomas corresponding to the skills units included in the training modules of this certificate.

#### **Legal basis**

Royal Decree 725/2011 of 20 May, establishing five professional certificates in the professional family Sound and Image, which is included in the National Repertoire of Professional Certificates. (Appendix III, Code: IMSV0308)



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#### 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

This certificate may be acquired by:

- 1. Training: Completion with a pass grade of the face-to-face or online training programme.
- 2. Recognition of the professional skills acquired through professional experience or non-formal training (prior learning): Completion of a process of skills evaluation and accreditation in all the skills units making up the professional certificate.
- 3. Dual training: Completion of a training and apprenticeship contract, which may range from 1 year (or 6 months, if stipulated as such in the collective agreement) to 3 years, during which effective working time is combined with time dedicated to training under the training programme for the professional certificate.

The training method (number 1 above) requires successful completion of the training modules and the practical training at the workplace:

#### **Entry/access requirements:**

- Bachiller Diploma (upper secondary education); or
- Professional Certificate Level 2 in the same professional area.
- If neither of the above or higher certifications are held, a pass in the key skills tests.

**Additional information:** Professional certificates are instruments for official accreditation of the professional qualifications in the National Catalogue of Professional Qualifications for all economic activities, within the scope of the labour administration. The National Repertoire of Professional Certificates is divided into three qualification levels (Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3), and by sectors into 26 professional families and 102 professional areas.
